- Pioneer a person who traveled and settled in a new area to live.
- Rancher a person who works or owns a farm or ranch.
- Cowboy a person who worked with cattle on a ranch and usually rode a horse while working.
- Founder a person who helped establish something new, like a city, county or organization.
- Slate a small chalkboard that children used to write their lessons on.
- Transit a surveyor's instrument for measuring angles.
- Cloche a woman's close-fitting hat, usually with deep rounded crown and narrow brim.
- Bloomers baggy underpants worn by girls and women.
- Knickers loose fitting underpants that reach just below the knee.
- Camisole a loose fitting sleeveless garment extending to the waist that is worn by women underneath a top.
- Salon a place where ladies can get their hair cut.
- Eau de toilette a type of perfume.
- Street car a rail vehicle that ran on tracks in downtown Greenville.
- Caddo Indians one of the main Native American groups that lived in Hunt County between 800 1700 AD.
- Hunt County one of the 1<sup>st</sup> counties created by the state of Texas.
